





Plan for the Implementation of Required Comprehensive Education Plan (CEP) Support Visits to Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) Schools during the 2021-22 School Year

Overview: To comply with ESSA and Commissioner's Regulations, DOE is required to conduct quarterly CEP support visits* to each of the 67 identified Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) schools. During these visits, each school will reflect on its progress toward meeting goals that align with its values and aspirations. In supporting the school, district and BCO staff will consider the extent to which the school has the necessary resources, systems, and school, family & community empowerment in place to execute its action plans and ensure progress for the identified subgroup(s).

Each collaborative visit will be led by a team that is configured by the Superintendent in consultation with the Executive Superintendent. The following is a **suggested** team configuration:

- <u>Co-lead:</u> Director of State Federal Program Implementation (DSFP) representing the BCO to facilitate the process, ensure SED protocols are followed and share outcomes.
- <u>Co-lead:</u> DOE Representative such as the Director of Continuous Improvement (DCI), Director of School Improvement (DSI) or Superintendent Designee who will provide specific context around school practices.
- <u>Subgroup Expert(s)</u>: BCO content specialists to provide expertise based on subgroup identification (MLL/ELL/SWD, etc.); required if school was identified for MLL/ELL or SWD subgroup.
